

HIGH DESERT TRAILS - SPECTATOR GUIDE

Welcome to the High Desert Trails Rally! Are you ready to watch the action? This guide will tell you when and where things are going to happen. Your safety and the safety of our competitors is our top priority, so please follow these guidelines:

1. **Sign the waiver. Get a wristband! This is mandatory.**
2. **Listen to marshals or officials.** (Orange vests, lanyard with credentials)
3. **Do not cross taped off or fenced off area.** (Caution tape, Snow fence)
4. **Keep OFF the stage. If you're not sure where the stage is stay clear!**
At least 50 feet from the road and away from the outside of turns.

Cars / Trucks: There is a parking area next to service where you can park and then walk to one of the spectator areas. Only registered vehicles are allowed in the service area. You may check out the service area on foot.

ATV or motorcycle: There is a perimeter road and fencing that circles the property, we ask that you keep alert and absolutely do not enter the stage road. Please do not go out of bounds in this area as you might end up on a hot stage. All access roads to the stage will be taped off with caution tape or snow fence. Keep in mind that you are guests on private property.

Spectator Hill: Just south of the parking area there will be a hill that you can access on foot. This offers views of a large part of the course and the start and finish of the stage. Please keep to the marked area.

Palapa: There is very limited access to the Palapa during the event. There is also very limited parking. You will NOT be able to leave while the event is running! Access to the Palapa will be CLOSED from 8:00AM to approximately 2:00PM and after the mid-day break at approximately 3:00 to 7:30PM. If you are planning to watch the rally from the Palapa – plan to be there the majority of the day and pack accordingly.

What's a Rally? Stage Rally or Rally Racing is production based vehicles (Subaru Impreza, Dodge Neon, etc) modified to run on dirt roads. The stage road is closed to all traffic, and vehicles are sent down one at a time in a race against the clock. The co-driver or navigator reads previously created notes to the driver telling them what's ahead. Vehicles must stick to the prescribed route. There are lots of competitive classes and rally can be done with motorcycles.
